CHEDRO Caraga Provides Services, Welcomes CHED Chairman Dr. J Prospero E. De Vera III During The Serbisyong Sapat Para sa Lahat Program in Agusan Del Norte

CHED Chairperson Dr. J. Prospero "Popoy" E. De Vera III visited Agusan Del Norte to represent President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. at the Handog ng Pangulo: Serbisyong Sapat Para sa Lahat Program held at Panaytayon Elementary School, RTR, Agusan Del Norte on September 13, 2024.

The program, which was launched on President Marcos's birthday, aimed to make government services more accessible to the public through a simultaneous distribution of government assistance by national line agencies across the country, as well as through the introduction of starter programs, training, and assistance.

CHED Caraga also provided services to the public through a Higher Education Booth during the event where personnel responded to inquiries regarding scholarship and grants-in-aid programs.

During Chairman De Vera's keynote speech he announced the directive of President Marcos to award additional 200 Tulong Dunong Program slots for higher education students in the Agusan Del Norte province, an announcement that was met with thunderous applause. A ceremonial awarding of various government assistance programs was also conducted, including the awarding of a ceremonial check to the Tertiary Education Subsidy (TES) grantees of Northern Mindanao Colleges, Inc. amounting to PHP 3,211,800.00. The chairman was joined in awarding these benefits by Agusan Del Norte Provincial Governor Hon. Maria Angelica Rosedell M. Amante, Vice Governor, Hon. Enrico R. Corvera, the Agusan Del Norte Sangguniang Panlalawigan Board Members, Municipal Mayor Hon. Richard Daquipil, Municipal Vice Mayor Hon. Eleuterio D. Enriquez, and members of the Sangguniang Bayan of RTR.

Also joining the chairman in this event were the Presidents of four (4) State Universities and Colleges of Caraga Region: Dr. Joy C. Capistrano, President of Agusan Del Sur State College of Agriculture and Technology (ASSCAT), Dr. Rolyn C. Daguil, President of Caraga State University (CSU); Dr. Nemesio G. Loayon, President of North Eastern Mindanao State University (NEMSU); and Dr. Alma S. Patron, OIC President of Surigao Del Norte State University (SNSU) and OIC Regional Director of CHED Caraga.

Earlier in the morning the chairman was welcomed upon his arrival by Dr. Patron and the Caraga Higher Education Institutions' Association of Presidents and Heads (CHEIAPH) at Bancasi Airport.

There were 37 slots allocated for the Caraga region for ACEF-GIAHEP grantees.

CHED Caraga Attends Mindanao Cluster Reorientation on the Scholarship for Coconut Farmers and Their Families

The Commission on Higher Education (CHED) successfully conducted a cluster reorientation on the Scholarship Program for Coconut Farmers and Their Families (CoScho) last August 9, 2024. Held at the Farm at Carpenter Hill, Koronadal City, South Cotabato, the event aimed to refresh the stakeholders' understanding of the program's guidelines and address implementation challenges.

Hosted by the CHED Region 12 Office, the reorientation brought together representatives from the CHED Regional Offices in Mindanao and their partner Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). All eight (8) participating HEIs from CHED Caraga - Saint Vincent de Paul Diocesan College (SVDPDC), Saint Michael College of Caraga (SMCC), Caraga State University Main and Cabadbaran City campuses (CSU), North Eastern Mindanao State University (NEMSU) Main and Lianga campuses, Agusan del Sur State College of Agriculture and Technology (ASSCAT), and Surigao del Norte State University Main Campus (SNSU Main) - were present.

The event aligned with Republic Act 7722, or the Higher Education Act of 1994, and Republic Act 11524, or the Coconut Farmers and Industry Trust Fund Act, as well as the Coconut Farmers and Industry Development Plan (CFIDP). Ms. Cynthia Q. Hernandez, OIC Chief Education Program Specialist of the Office of Student Development and Services (OSDS), provided a comprehensive overview of the CoScho program's implementing guidelines. An open forum followed to clarify concerns on coconut farmers' qualifications, documentary requirements, and eligibility criteria.

With the successful conduct of this reorientation, CHED and its partners reaffirm their commitment to empowering coconut farmers and their families through accessible and quality higher education. By addressing challenges, the CoScho Program is a vital step towards a more prosperous and sustainable coconut industry.

CHED Caraga Conducts Mid-Year Assessment and Planning for Fiscal Year 2024

The workshop outputs were presented by each focal person for review and additional comments of the body.

The festival, organized by the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Caraga Regional Office, in partnership with the Philippine Coconut Authority (PCA) and other Coconut Farmers and Industry Development Plan (CFIDP) implementing agencies, aims to boost the region's coconut industry through product demonstrations and selling fairs.

Among the event participants of the 2nd Caraga Coconut Festival included the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), Commission on Higher Education (CHED), Land Bank of the Philippines (LBP), and Development Bank of the Philippines (DBP), among others. Representing CHED Caraga were Dr. Alma S. Patron, Phd, RSW, OIC of the Office of the Director IV; Ms. Noeme Rose D. Mani, CPA, MM, Supervising Education Program Specialist; and Ms. Kate Russel B. DTI Caraga Regional Director Gay Tidalgo, CESO IV, extended a warm welcome to the attendees and delivered an inspiring message. She emphasized the coconut industry's significance as a vital source of livelihood for many Caraganon families, empowering them to improve their lives. Emphasizing the coconut tree's versatility, she explained that every part, from its roots to its leaves, can be beneficial with the right tools and skills.



The Regional Manager of PCA Caraga, Mr. Joel B. Oclarit, gave his message of support by announcing plans to plant dwarf coconut trees, which offer a faster growth cycle. Several prominent figures, including Hon. Ronnie Vicente C. Lagnada, Mayor of Butuan City, represented by Hon. Joseph Omar O. Andaya, City Counselor of LGU Butuan; Hon. Ma. Angelica Rosedell M. Amante, Governor of Agusan del Norte, represented by Provincial Administrator Elizabeth Marie R. Calo; and Samuel Roculas, Chairperson of the Coconut Farmer Federation in Caraga, also conveyed their support for the implementing agencies of the CFIDP and their efforts to assist the industry.

Following the ribbon-cutting ceremony and the CFIDP solidarity group photo is a product demonstration and presentation that highlighted a diverse array of offerings from several provinces, including Surigao del Sur and the Dinagat Islands.

The 2nd Caraga Coconut Festival once again reaffirmed its commitment to promoting the coconut industry, fostering opportunities, and driving innovation that benefit the region and the country.

CHED Caraga Conducts Joint Monitoring of SUCs LUDIP with DBM Caraga

The Commission on Higher Education - Caraga Regional Office (CHED Caraga) joined the Department of Budget and Management Caraga Regional Office (DBM Caraga) in the conduct of a series of joint monitoring activities of ongoing infrastructure projects of the four (4) State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) in the Caraga region according to the SUCs' approved Land Use Development and Infrastructure Plan (LUDIP). The onsite monitoring activities were conducted from September 18 to 25, 2024 and were held onsite at the campuses of the SUCs.

The following four (4) SUCs monitored: Caraga State University (CSU) on September 18, 2024, Surigao Del Norte State University (SNSU) on September 20, 2024, Agusan Del Sur State College of Agriculture and Technology (ASSCAT) on September 23, 2024, and North Eastern Mindanao State University (NEMSU) on September 24-25, 2024. The monitoring team was led by its respective agency heads, DBM Caraga Regional Director Dr. Maria Fe D. Jagna, CESO III and OIC CHED Caraga Regional Director Dr. Alma S. Patron, PhD, RSW.





The objectives for the monitoring were as follows: • Thorough inspections of ongoing infrastructure projects to monitor compliance with timelines and budget allocations:

• Validate the completion status of infrastructure projects to confirm that they have been executed according to the approved specifications and within the allocated budget, and assess its functionality and usability to ensure they meet the intended objectives and serve the needs of students and staff effectively;

• Review and assess the proposed priority projects for the upcoming budget years to ensure they align with the LUDIP of the SUCs and provide recommendations based on current and completed project evaluations to guide the prioritization and allocation of funds for future infrastructure developments; and

• Establish a work-in-progress compendium that consolidates information on all infrastructure projects within the SUC.

CHED Caraga Conducts Orientation on Transnational Higher Education in the Context of Tourism and Hospitality Education

The Commission on Higher Education - Caraga Regional Office (CHED Caraga), in cooperation with the Caraga Council of Tourism Deans and Educators (CCTDE), conducted an orientation on the Transnational Higher Education in the Context of Tourism and Hospitality Education on September 26, 2024 at Balanghai Hotel and Convention Center, Butuan City.

The seminar was attended by the deans and educators of various tourism and hospitality programs of 16 Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in the region, all of which were acknowledged and recognized by CCTDE President Dr. Celso E. Felipe Jr. and welcomed by CHED Caraga Chief Education Program Specialist Dr. Julia Felisa C. Martinez.

The orientation proper was delivered by Project Technical Staff III for Internationalization Ms. Kershey Reign E. Dueñas, who discussed the salient provisions of the Republic Act. No. 11448 or the Transnational Higher Education (TNHE) Law, and other related issuances and programs. Representing the Regional Focal Person for Internationalization, Education Supervisor II Mr. Amy C. Saavedra, she also discussed the Philippine Internationalization Roadmap and the Ways Forward for Caraga HEIs with tourism and hospitality programs.

Dr. Gloria Baken Wong Siy, President Emeritus and National Lead Trainer for the Association of Administrators in the Hospitality, Hotel and Restaurant Management Educational Institutions (AAHRMEI), served as the guest speaker for the activity. She discussed the Perspectives on Internationalization in the Context of Tourism and Hospitality Education as a seasoned expert in the tourism education sector.
